Start the new year in 2020 with a renewed sense of hope by joining in reading Beautiful Hope: Finding Hope Every Day in a Broken World! This book is divided into four sections: Choosing Hope; Hope in the Church; Hope in Action; and Becoming Hope. The Value Traditional Educational Choice (EdChoice)

Parents are the primary educators of their children; and have the right to choose a school for their children that corresponds with their personal convictions and provides the environment they want for them to grow spiritually, academically, emotionally, and physically.

St. Barbara's School welcomes families of all faith traditions who share our values and desire the faith-filled environment and academic challenges our school offers.

This October, The Ohio Department of Education released an updated list of those schools who are underperforming. This list has grown considerably.

The following schools in our surrounding area are on this list:

Fairless Local School District: Fairless Elementary School – grades K-5 Massillon City School District: Franklin Elementary School – grades K-3 Gorrell Elementary School – K-3 Massillon Junior High School – Grades 7-8 Perry Local School District: Genoa Elementary School – grades K-4 Lohr Elementary School – grades K-4 Northwest Local School District: W. S. Stinson Elementary School – grades 3-5

Students who currently live in and attend any of the schools listed above (or any of the schools who meet the criteria for academic concern on the Ohio Department of Education website) are eligible to apply for an EdChoice scholarship

The 2020-2021 Ed Choice Scholarship would award students the opportunity of attending a private school free of charge and keep their scholarship through high school graduation, as long as their family resides continually in the public-school district.

As a Catholic School Leader, I value the importance of providing

parents with educational options. If you reside in a failing school district, I highly encourage you to explore and consider this opportunity for educational choice. I invite you to tour St. Barbara's School and discuss the advantages of what a private school and Catholic education has to offer.
