A Note from Fr. Matthew

A new mom's epiphany

She had her first daughter at the beginning of the pandemic two years ago. It was a new experience for her, to be sure, to create a safe, warm home for another human being. During those first days, she fell in love with little Marcelline and found a new, deeper love for her husband Evan.

But another epiphany was to come. New mom Rachel Stevens writes in **The New York Times** [November 28, 2021]:

"When my mother came out to help us for four months, I saw her love in a new way too. She never once got frustrated with Marcelline, who cried and cried as my mother held her close and sang to her. When Marcelline fell asleep, my mother asked for a pillow so she could prop the arm holding up my sleeping baby's head. Then they sat there and rocked for hours.

"You did this for me?' I asked.

"She nodded and smiled. I don't remember my reply, but I'm sure I was crying. I was crying a lot during this time. I was my mother's first child, so she couldn't help but giggle through my freakouts and hold me tighter through my legitimate worries. She had learned with me, and now I learned from her . . . "

We all have "splinters" — and maybe a "beam" — that obstructs our vision. Self-centeredness, avarice and ambition can make us blind to the pain we inflict on others and the injustice we perpetuate. But more often than not, we suffer from a "splinter" of fear in a given moment that disables our ability to realize the help that is available to us through the generosity of others. Those "splinters" can become major obstructions in our failure to express gratitude, to respond to such generosity in kind. Many of us can identify with this new mother and what she learns about love and parenting from her own mom. Jesus challenges all who would be his followers to dare to remove from our own eyes the "wooden beams" that limit our vision to our own immediate concerns in order to see with clarity and peace the love of God in our midst.

practice of our faith. However, call to mind what you would traditionally give up or do for Lent. Does it truly draw you closer to Christ and encourage you to meditate on his sacrifice for us? Be inspired this Lent to choose something different. Even if it is only one small step to increase your faith. What is a way that you can increase your prayer life? How can you add

Scripture study into your everyday life? Could you substitute time listening to music on the radio for time listening to a Catholic program or to Christian

music? You may find that one small change sparks a new habit in your life that helps you to grow closer to the Lord. Jesus Christ sacrificed his life out of love for us. His life. Is sacrificing sweets for the next 40 days a sufficient reminder to you? As we continue to express concern in our world over vari-

ous things that our wrong – prevailing concerns over Covid and other serious

health issues, frustrations with a culture that shows little respect for the dignity of human life from conception to natural death, widespread division among everyone, including in families and in the church – why not consider if God is calling you to something more this Lent?

The Religious Education Room (located at the east side of the building, near the men's restroom) has many free items that parishioners are welcome to borrow to help you grow in your faith. (See below for items relating to Lent

and Holy Week.) Consider if you could "give up" some of your free time this Lent to reading more about your faith and growing spiritually. There are books about how to study and pray with Scripture,

books about what the Catholic Church teaches if you want to learn about something specific or need to review, books about saints, and books about prayer. We are fortunate to have multiple copies of some books if you would like to study together with a small group of friends or with your family members.

We ask that you respect the library materials and return them in a timely manner for others to use and enjoy. There is a sign-out list for you to write which items you are borrowing and when you return them. A special thank you to Mackenzie Brenner and several of our Confirmation candidates for serving the church by helping to organize these materials!
