A Note from Fr. Matthew

The reign of Lilibet

As a child, she struggled to pronounce her own name. She would say "Lilibet" and that became her family's nickname for her.



"Lilibet" was never supposed to be queen. According to the order of succession, her father's older brother would be the next King of England — and that was perfectly fine with Lilibet's shy and self-deprecating father. In January 1936, her uncle David succeeded her grandfather George V to become King Edward VIII. But before the year was out, Edward would scandalize the world by abdicating the throne to marry the twice-divorced American Wallis Warfield Simpson. Lilibet's father Bertie would succeed Edward, becoming King George VI. The ten-year-old princess was now next in line to the British throne.

The lessons Lilibet learned over the next decade made her the queen she would become. When the German Luftwaffe began their relentless bombing raids on London at the outset of World War II, King George and his wife, Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, refused to be evacuated to Canada. They insisted on enduring the dangers and privations along with their subjects. Their courage and dedication endeared the family to the beleaguered nation forever.

Lilibet spent her teen years knitting socks for British soldiers, collecting tinfoil and rolling bandages for the war effort. She would send her five-shilling weekly allowance to child-welfare funds, wear second-hand clothes, and adhere to war war-rations diet imposed on all Britons. In 1944, when she reached the mandatory military age of 18, she joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service, one of Britain's wartime women's units. The princess trained as a truck driver and mechanic. She spent her days covered with grease and grime — and well-earned pride.

In 1952, while on a goodwill trip to Kenya, her father died unexpectedly. And so began Lilibet's reign as Queen Elizabeth II, the longest reigning a monarch in the history of Great Britain. The speech she gave on her 21st birthday five years before echoed at her coronation and continued to be the theme of her 70 years as queen: "I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong."

The reign of Queen Elizabeth II will not be remembered for exercises of great political power or great policy initiatives, but for stability and civility, for her ability to bring the many different perspectives and interests of her country together. Her authority was centered in her grace and dignity, her sense of duty and sacrifice for the people and nation she was called by accident of birth to serve. Queen Elizabeth's Il's dedication to duty and service mirrors the "rule" and "authority" of the reign of Christ. On this last Sunday of the Church year, we honor Christ the King whose rule is one of humble service; Christ the King whose crown is compassion, whose scepter is humility; Christ the King whose court belongs to the poor, the forgotten, the lost, the despairing; Christ the King whose coin is forgiveness and reconciliation.


