#### A Note from Fr. Matthew

#### The parable of the bees and the great tree

In the writings of Sufi Islam is a parable about a great tree that grew in the middle of a forest. A colony of bees made their nest in the trunk of the great tree, where they produced their honey. For many years the bees and the



tree flourished, but over time the great tree aged and eventually fell due to rot and decay.

The other bees of the wood wondered what this meant. Some bees believed that the tree's fall was a punishment for the bees' lack of faith and gratitude to God. More compassionate bees tried to help the homeless bees by sharing their own nests. Other bees thought that the homeless bees must be sinners and miscreants: in destroying their tree, God was punishing them for their evil deeds, whatever they may be.

But soon, blight and age destroyed all the trees of the forest. All the bees were now homeless. The bees had taken the great trees for granted, never realizing how dependent they were on the trees for their livelihood.

Sadder still, each colony believed that they were God's "chosen" hive, destined to survive and establish a great future for the generations of bees to follow them. The poor bees had failed to look further than their own hive and consider the effects of their hives on the trees, the soil and the rest of the ecology on which their survival depended. None of the colonies realized that they all lived in the uncertainty and precariousness of a changing, evolving world, and that each colony, each bee, needed to see their work as part of something greater than their colony, something more complete than just their own honey.

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to embrace a greater vision of our world and our place in it. The earth does not exist to serve us; others were not created by God to do our bidding or fill our needs. The bees in the Sufi story valued the forest only to the extent that it served them; most saw other bees as competitors, as less "bee" than they were, as objects of their pity. The understanding that we are all of the same substance, that we are trustees of the world and responsible for the good of one another, is the core of humility that Jesus calls his followers to embrace. The word "humility" comes from the same root as the word "humus" - "of the earth." Humility recognizes that we are all "of the earth," that we are all equal before God. Authentic faith is centered in such humility: humility that begins with valuing life as a gift from God, a gift we have received only through God's mysterious love, not through anything we have done to deserve it. To follow Jesus is to put ourselves in the humble, demanding role of servant to others, to intentionally seek the happiness and fulfillment of those we love regardless of the cost to ourselves.
