

Thinking your time is so valuable or your talent is better than anyone else or your money gives you status is another way of making those things "gods" before God. Pride is the opposite of humility. Remember, all that we have and all that we are is a gift from God. We should be humbled by God's incredible generosity and be grateful for all we have been given. Ultimately, gratitude leads us to humility.

A Note from Fr. Matthew

A promise made and kept to Mama . . .

Attorney Bryan Stevenson is the founder of the Equal Justice Initiative, a nonprofit law office in Montgomery, Alabama, dedicated to defending the poor, the incarcerated and the wrongly convicted.



In a widely viewed "TED" presentation, Bryan Stevenson talked about his work and how he got into it. The "call," he says, came when he was eight or nine years old and his grandmother sat him down for "a talk." "Mama," as she was called, was the daughter of slaves. She was tough, but also loving. Her experience of slavery shaped the way she saw the world.

On this particular morning, Mama sat little Bryan down. Bryan recalls that talk like it was yesterday.

"She took me out back and said, 'Bryan, I'm going to tell you something, but you don't tell anybody what I tell you.' I said, 'OK, Mama.' She said, 'Now, you make sure you don't do that.' I said, 'Sure.' Then she sat me down and she looked at me, and she said, 'I want you to know I've been watching you.' And she said, 'I think you're special.' She said, 'I think you can do anything you want to do.' I will never forget it.

"And then she said, 'I just need you to promise me three things, Bryan.' I said, 'OK, Mama.' She said, 'The first thing I want you to promise me is that you'll always love your mom. That's my baby girl, and you have to promise me now you'll always take care of her.' Well, I adored my mom, so I said, 'Yes, Mama. I'll do that.' Then she said, 'The second thing I want you to promise me is that you'll always do the right thing, even when the right thing is the hard thing.' And I thought about it, and I said, 'Yes, Mama. I'll do that.' Then finally, she said, 'The third thing I want you to promise me is that you'll never drink alcohol.' "Well, I was nine years old, so I said, 'Yes, Mama. I'll do that.'

Then, one afternoon when Bryan was 14 or 15, his older brother offered him his first beer. Bryan backed away. Bryan's brother insisted, "What's wrong with you? Have some beer." Then it dawned on his brother: "Oh, I hope you're not still hung up on that conversation Mama had with you."

"What are you talking about?" Bryan asked. "Oh, Mama tells all the grand-kids that they're special."

"I was devastated," Bryan Stevenson remembers. "And I'm going to admit something to you. I'm going to tell you something I probably shouldn't . . . But I'm 52 years old, and I'm going to admit to you that I've never had a drop of alcohol. I don't say that because I think that's virtuous; I say that because there is power in identity. When we create the right kind of identity, we can say things to the world around us that they don't actually believe make sense. We can get them to do things that they don't think they can do. When I thought about my grandmother, of course she would think all her grandkids were special. My grandfather was in prison during prohibition. My male uncles died of alcohol-related diseases. And these were the things she thought we needed to commit to."

The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector is a parable about self-absorption colliding with selflessness, arrogance uprooted by humility, greed succumbing to the common good. Mama instills in her grandson Bryan a sense of purpose and meaning exemplified in her own selfless love and humble optimism. Mama's "talk" and Bryan's understanding of his "identity" and commitment to the cause of justice for the poor and powerless stands — or kneels — in sharp contrast to the Pharisaic attitude of moral and cultural superiority over others. God is not just "ours"; God has not breathed his life into us solely for our own happiness and satisfaction. Humility that compels us to treat others with respect and generosity will be exalted in the reign of God, a reign that is realized, here and now, on our own soccer fields, and marketplaces and dinner tables — and court rooms.


