A Note from Fr. Matthew

Mrs. Harris Goes to Paris"

One of the most charming films of the year is Mrs. Harris Goes to Paris, based on the novel by Paul Gallico.



Ada Harris is a London war widow, one of society's

"invisible" people. She makes her living cleaning houses and flats. Her skill and hard work are equaled only to her good will and grace. In one house, she sees a beautiful Christian Dior gown that takes her breath away. Ada vows to own something so beautiful. Even though the price is well above her means, she manages to scrape the money together and treks off to Paris.

When she arrives at the House of Dior to buy a dress, Ada is rebuffed by the haughty director. The imperious Madame Colbert does not want a shabby little Englishwoman anywhere near the Dior brand and their aristocratic customers:

"Why do you come here, Mrs. Harris? Evidenment, the rich and the titled must be seen, admired, copied. But this Dior dress that you desire so much, where will you wear it? At the Vienna Opera Ball? Or Queen Charlotte's? Will you wear it to polish floors? Or will you keep it shut in your little wardrobe? A Dior dress is designed to astonish and delight. How will you do that, Mrs. Harris? Forgive me for saying this, but you are a nobody, invisible. How will you give this dress the life it deserves?"

But Ada will not put off. Opening her bag, she dumps the 500 pounds she's saved on Madame Colbert's desk.

"It's my dream," Ada says. "And my money's as good as anybody else's." Realizing she has been defeated, Madame Colbert snarls, "You may buy your dream, but what will you do with it?"

A great deal, it turns out. It's not the gown she scrapes to buy but Ada herself who "astonishes and delights." Her "pluck" wins her the admiration and support of many of the Dior staff who come to her rescue - and Ada returns their help by her kindness and wisdom. As her dress is being made, Ada serves as a compassionate listener, a wise matchmaker and even a labor leader. Her "invisible" skills as a cook, housekeeper and seamstress win over even the most skeptical of the Dior creators.

For the first time in her life, Ada Harris refuses to settle for being "invisible." She deserves to own an item of beauty even if it will just hang in her closet (spoiler alert: it won't). Ada discovers her courage and generosity are as much "works of art" as the meticulously constructed gowns of Christian Dior.

Madame Colbert's protectiveness of the privileged status of Christian Dior is driven by a Pharisee-like consuming sense of superiority over others. Ada Harris, on the other hand, possesses the tax collector's humility, enabling her to realize the goodness and mercy of God in her own life and to be the means for others she meets to know that same goodness and mercy in theirs. In the eyes of God, no one is "invisible"; in the heart of God, all are embraced as "astonishing" and a "delight." We best give thanks for God's love for us by returning that love to one another; in accepting one another as God accepts us, we honor God as Father of us all in our honoring one another as brothers and sisters.
